Another recent development of which I am particularly proud is Koonambil's participation as a founding member of the Northern Inland Aged and Community Care (NIACC) alliance.

The **NIACC Alliance** is a group of independent, like minded, not-for profit aged care facilities like ours. Together, we have increased buying power and more opportunities to boost our income. Alone, Koonambil is a 30 bed facility, but as part of the NIACC Alliance, we can negotiate as part of a 500 bed collective.

The Alliance will also help protect members from being vulnerable to takeovers, and ultimately maintain our future viability.

So far, NIACC has procured suppliers of insurance, continence aids, wound care and medical supplies. By calling for tenders as a group, members such Koonambil can access cost savings that weren't previously available. Shortly, NIACC will engage a specialist to help members make effective claims for government funding. This will ensure income of our facilities is maximised so that can provide appropriate care for our residents.


Residents love physio services which are offered four days each month. Since the beginning of the year, Rob Martinez has been helping residents maintain manage pain, mobility, flexibility and dexterity. All residents have recently taken part in the Berge Balance Scale and Fitness Test. We do this every six months to make sure the benefits of exercise are maximised for residents' balance and fitness. This also gives staff an opportunity to reassess residents and their abilities.

A new care chair is giving comfort to incapacitated residents by preventing pressure areas, reducing agitation and most importantly, reducing isolation by helping residents remain integrated in the Koonambil community by taking part in daily activities such as garden walks. Another piece equipment is a height adjustable commode chair which is making a big difference for care delivery.

Our chef Allison recently attended the aged-care specific Flavour Creations catering course where she learnt to prepare pureed foods with a shape and texture that provides an authentic dining experience. Residents are very appreciative of her passion to learn and cater for all individual needs and conditions like dysphagia.
